

Les pronoms interrogatifs (I)

Ils sont utilisés pour demander **qui a fait quoi, à qui, pourquoi, avec quoi**, etc.

On choisit le pronom en fonction de sa fonction, comme dans ce tableau:

	sujet grammatical	objet	objet d'une préposition
personne	who	whom	whom
chose	what	what	what

> **sujet (personne) : who + question**

Who did this painting?

Who wants to get an ice cream?

> **sujet (chose) : what + question**

What interests you?

What is good in this restaurant?

> **objet direct (personne) : whom + question**

Whom did you see in France?

Whom are you going to meet at this reception?

> **objet direct (chose) : what + question**

What do you want to do this evening?

What are you preparing?

> **objet d'une préposition (personne) : préposition + whom + question**


About **whom** are you thinking?

With **whom** did you go out?

Note: En anglais oral, on place souvent la préposition en fin de phrase, ce qui implique qu'on utilise "who" à la place de "whom".

Who are you thinking about?

Who did you go out with?
